Take your first steps towards a career working with animals by gaining the knowledge and practical skills for a job role within the animal care industry. Learn through a mixture of theory and practical work.

You will complete work experience in the land-based industries e.g. at kennels, grooming parlour, pet shop or veterinary practice and learn how to look after animals.

At Level 3, you will develop your theory and learn more about nutrition and feeding, zoology, animal science, husbandry and welfare.

You could progress on to higher education or employment in animal care - veterinary surgeries, animal welfare organisations, laboratories, retail or wildlife centres.

You will gain lots of experience working and dealing with horses at our fantastic facilities including feeding and watering, routine stable duties, horse handling, biology and principles of horse behaviour. Rising skills will also be developed on our indoor and outdoor arenas.

At Level 3, you will learn more about the principles and practices of equestrianism and horse husbandry. You will ride horses and study their nutrition and anatomy. Trips are offered to Newmarket and Ireland and to livery yards.

You could progress on to higher education e.g. HNC/HND Equine Management with Kirklees College, university course or employment in the equine industry e.g. livery yard, riding schools, retail, stables or stud work or therapy and rehabilitation.

Former equine student Amelia Grey won a national British Education Award in 2017, celebrating her academic success at Kirklees College.

She worked hard to overcome many challenges in her life, having been born with congenital cataracts and nystagmus, meaning she had to work much harder to achieve than her peer group.

Outside of college she volunteered with Camp America in New York, USA, teaching riding to young people with learning difficulties and disabilities.

Amelia also won a College Outstanding Learner Success Award in December 2015.
