

### COLLEGE POLICY FOR THE WEARING OF FACE MASKS IN COMMUNAL AREAS

In order to keep the college community safe during the pandemic and to minimise the risk of transmissions to our friends and families, all students and staff must wear a face mask at all times outside the classroom.

Face masks must be put on before leaving a classroom and worn at all times in communal areas. Communal areas include corridors, refectory, atrium, break out areas, reception areas.

It is vital that face coverings are worn correctly:

- Covering the face and mouth
- Fit comfortably and securely against the side of the face
- Be secured to the head with ties or ear loops
- Made of breathable material e.g. cotton
- Ideally include two layers of fabric

In addition to the above, staff and students should not wear masks that:

- Display political messages/slogans
- Depict images that may cause fear
- Display offensive images or language
- Display nudity

While all students are expected to bring their own face mask when attending college, anybody who does not have a face covering will be provided with one on entry to any college site.

Some staff/students are exempt from wearing a mask due to health or personal reasons. Students who are exempt should contact their Progress Coach, Study Programme Leader or Tutor to receive a free sunflower lanyard and / or exemption card.

All exemptions must be registered by Wednesday 18 November.

It is vital that all members of the college community follow this policy.

#### RUN, HIDE, TELL

Given that the National Threat Level has been raised to severe, please continue to remain vigilant and be increasingly observant and aware at all times. In the rare event of an attack, please remind yourself of the run, hide, tell procedure.







#### **MAKE YOURSELF SAFE**

In the rare event of an attack



If the way is clear to a safe place, run away from the threat, e.g. exit building or find a place away from the danger.





Find a safe place which will ideally have:

- A lockable door:
- Substantial, solid walls on all four sides; A place where you can hide out of sight;
- Windows that can be shut;
- Windows that have blinds or curtains that can be closed;
- · Lights that can be turned off;
- Some means of communication.
