SUPPORT VIDEOS FOR REMOTE LEARNING

If students are struggling to access a device during lockdown but have a games console connected to the internet, they can still access college services, such as Microsoft Teams and Office 365. Although some functions could be limited, they will have access to virtual classes, see their tutor and use voice and text chat. They will need a games console, controller, compatible headset, a USB keyboard and subscription to their console's online gaming service to access the systems.
