All students have now been invited to our Huddersfield test centre or Kirklees community testing centre via appointment for their first Covid-19 test.

After three tests have been taken at a testing centre, students will move to twiceweekly testing at home using home testing kits distributed through college.

Face to face teaching is resuming from Monday 15 March for students who have been notified. Remote learning will still be in place for those who have not yet been invited to return to college.

Whilst we're looking forward to welcoming students back, it is vital that all the Covid-19 guidelines continue to be implemented to keep the college community as safe as possible.

NATIONAL CHILD EXPLOITATION AWARENESS DAY




On 18 March, we want to unite against child exploitation.
