Re: Kirklees College NHS COVID-19 Vaccination Grab-a-Jab Pop-Up

In support of the national campaign to vaccinate all 16 and 17 year olds, Kirklees College is hosting NHS COVID-19 Vaccination Pop-Up Sessions week commencing Monday 13 September.

The vaccination pop-ups will be located at the following centres:

- Huddersfield Centre (Landings 72) Monday 13 September
- Springfield Sixth Form Centre (Refectory) Tuesday 14 September

In order for us to reach as many students as possible, there will also be a mobile clinic operating at our other centres on the following dates:

- Brunel Construction Centre Monday 13 September
- Engineering Centre Monday 13 September
- Taylor Hill Animal Centre Tuesday 14 September

The vaccination pop-up is open to all students, including apprentices, aged 16 and 17 years who have yet to have had their dose of the COVID-19 vaccine.

It is also open to students who are 17¾ years and older, and those aged 16 and 17 years who are at higher risk of serious COVID-19, who are eligible for their first or second dose. (Second doses are 8 weeks or more after the first.)

All students have been sent information from the college about the vaccination popup, how to access it and sources of further information.

The vaccine being offered is Pfizer-BioNTech. One dose of vaccine has been shown to provide 80% protection against hospitalisation from COVID-19. Protection could be even higher, as younger people respond better to vaccines and some will already have had the COVID-19 infection, meaning they will have an even better response to the first dose.













Within two weeks of the NHS routinely offering COVID-19 vaccination to 16 and 17 year olds over 360,000 had taken up the offer and received their vaccination.

Further COVID-19 Vaccination-Related Information and Links

- The Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI) advises that 16 and 17 year olds should be offered one dose of the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine.
- No proof of identity is required for vaccination name, date of birth, and address (if have one) is all that is needed.
- Parental consent isn't needed for 16 and 17 year olds to be vaccinated (unless there is significant evidence to suggest individuals are unable to give informed consent).
- There is no requirement to be registered with a GP or have an NHS number to be vaccinated.
- People self-isolating, waiting for a COVID-19 test or within 4 weeks of having a positive COVID-19 test shouldn't attend for vaccination.

- After vaccination it's still important to:
 - Wear a face mask where advised
 - Wash hands regularly
 - Open windows to let fresh air in
 - o Follow the current guidance
 - o Get other routine vaccinations for young people.
- In addition to the college pop-up, information on the nearest vaccination centre can be found through the NHS's 'grab a jab' online walk-in finder.
