Re: Kirklees College NHS COVID-19 Vaccination Grab-a-Jab Pop-Up

In support of the national campaign to vaccinate all 16 and 17 year olds, Kirklees College is hosting NHS COVID-19 Vaccination Pop-Up Sessions week commencing Monday 13 September.

The vaccination pop-ups will be located at the following centres:

- Huddersfield Centre (Landings 72) Monday 13 September
- Springfield Sixth Form Centre (Refectory) Tuesday 14 September

In order for us to reach as many students as possible, there will also be a mobile clinic operating at our other centres on the following dates:

- Brunel Construction Centre Monday 13 September
- Engineering Centre Monday 13 September
- Taylor Hill Animal Centre Tuesday 14 September

Appointments can be booked through https://tinyurl.com/kirkleescollege.

Whilst it is advised that you make a booking using the link above, walk-in appointments will also be available.

The vaccination pop-up is open to all students, including apprentices, aged 16 and 17 years who have yet to have had their dose of the COVID-19 vaccine.

It is also open to students who are 17¾ years and older, and those aged 16 and 17 years who are at higher risk of serious COVID-19, who are eligible for their first or second dose. (Second doses are 8 weeks or more after the first.)

The vaccine being offered is Pfizer-BioNTech. One dose of vaccine has been shown to provide 80% protection against hospitalisation from COVID-19. Protection could be even higher, as younger people respond better to vaccines and some will already have had the COVID-19 infection, meaning they will have an even better response to the first dose.













Within two weeks of the NHS routinely offering COVID-19 vaccination to 16 and 17 year olds over 360,000 had taken up the offer and received their vaccination.

You do not need parental consent to book a vaccine but we do ask that you make your parent/guardian aware that you have booked your vaccine.

Further COVID-19 Vaccination-Related Information and Links

- The Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI) advises that 16 and 17 year olds should be offered one dose of the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine.
- You don't need any proof of identity to be vaccinated. At the session all you need to give is your name, date of birth, and address (if you have one).
- Parental consent isn't needed for 16 and 17 year olds to be vaccinated (unless there is significant evidence to suggest individuals are unable to give informed consent).
- You do not have to be registered with a GP or have an NHS number to be vaccinated.
- Don't come to a vaccine appointment if you are self-isolating, waiting for a COVID-19 test or within 4 weeks of having a positive COVID-19 test.

- After vaccination it's still important to:
 - Wear a face mask where advised
 - Wash your hands regularly
 - Open windows to let fresh air in
 - Follow the current guidance
 - Get other routine vaccinations for young people.
- In addition to the college pop-up, you can find you nearest vaccination centre through the NHS's 'grab a jab' online walk-in finder.
