Parent Portal and Next of Kin Information

Don't forget that you can view your young person's progress via Parent Portal through the college website. Information will have been sent to the parental email address provided at enrolment. If you don't have access, please email Jo Knowles, jo.knowles@kirkleescollege.ac.uk with the email address and mobile phone number you would like to be registered with and the name and student number of your young person. You will then be sent a link to pro-portal. This mobile phone number will also be used as our emergency next of kin contact.

What is Century?

Century is an online resource for English and maths that creates personalised learning activities for students following the completion of a short diagnostic assessment online. This can identify areas of development for them, support completing homework and provide revision techniques.

All students are timetabled for one-hour independent study a week on Century and we would appreciate your support in encouraging students to complete this activity.

To log on, students can use their college email address. The password is auto-set to password1 and then asks them to set their own password.





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Reporting an Absence

As a parent/carer, you can help us by ensuring your young person takes responsibility for reporting any absence, exactly the same as if they were in employment. To help us accurately record student absence, please use the following methods:

REASONS FOR ABSENCE	REASON / DESCRIPTION
SICK	If unwell, we do not need details of the actual illness
STUCK	Problems with getting to college because of transport or child care
MEDICAL	Doctors/hospital/dental/optician etc. appointments
FORMAL	NUS work/probation/court appearance/job interview
RESPECT	Bereavement/funeral of close family member
LATE	If you are delayed coming into college

Type ONE of the reasons for absence words and the student enrolment number, using the format below:

MEDICAL (space) enrolment number E.g. MEDICAL 1804652

Please do not send other information to this text number. This is a no reply number and your message will not be received.

Exam Access Arrangements

Is your young person eligible for Exam Access Arrangements?

This could be for example:

- Rest break
- Extra time
- Reader/scribe
- Use of a laptop/computer
- Assistive technology
- Adapted resources

The deadline for referrals was Friday 28 October for courses starting in September/October. New diagnosis or previously unidentified medical needs will be assessed and processed in a timely manner. We will still accept your request but please note it may not get processed for this academic year. If you had support and your needs have not changed then you do not need to re-apply.

The Exams team and SEND team are working closely with curriculum teams to arrange access arrangements assessments for students that require them. Please can you encourage your young person to attend any appointment they may receive as appointments are limited and we need to maximise utilisation of them.

- College UCAS deadline to allow tutors to complete references etc. is 9 December 2022
- UCAS set application deadline is 25 January 2023
- Student Finance applications open February 2023
- UCAS Extra / Clearing opens 23 February or late applications or students with no offers

Careers Service

Kirklees College Careers team provide impartial expert information, advice and guidance to help students make the best decisions for them on learning, training and work.

Students can either drop in to see the Careers team or book an appointment and we can arrange for a phone call, email or teams meeting, whatever suits the student's needs.

Our careers advisors are based at the Huddersfield Centre but we do provide support to students at all of the college centres. The team also organise careers fairs for Employability Week, National Apprenticeship Week and Higher Education (HE) Week, as well as providing UCAS support for those wishing to progress to university.

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
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What's happened this term?
