WHERE WILL YOU BE STUDYING?

Huddersfield Centre is located in the town centre and is a short walk from the bus and train stations. At this centre, you will have access to the college gym for free, a Starbucks, a large refectory and cash machine. Set across two floors, the LRC has plenty of course textbooks and computers. You will learn in hair and beauty salons that are open to the public. Media Makeup students will utilise the media studio for classes. The courses in this department are practical and hands-on and will require you to work on yourself, family, friends and paying customers.

Pioneer Higher Skills Centre is a historic building that has been transformed into our latest learning facility in the centre of Dewsbury and is only a short walk from the train and bus stations. Hair and Beauty students and our barbers are based in salons on the ground and first floor of this building which are open to the public. Students have access to a coffee shop, Warsi's Cafe, free Wi-Fi and LRC located on the top floor.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Your timetable will usually be 16 hours a week. If you don't have GCSE grade 4 in English and maths then resitting these will be built into your study programme.

All students will require a kit for their chosen course and will need to wear salon uniform. This will be available to purchase from college and will cost approximately £200. The salons have commercial contracts with professional suppliers as well as selling GHD products. Further information about the cost of your kit will be sent out closer to enrolment.

You can download Microsoft software for free and access free Wi-Fi at college. If you need to access IT equipment, you can borrow devices from the LRC.

All 16 – 18 students have the opportunity to join our Sports Academy, if your timetable allows. We have a Football Academy and Rugby Academy, which both offer you the chance to train in your chosen field alongside your studies. 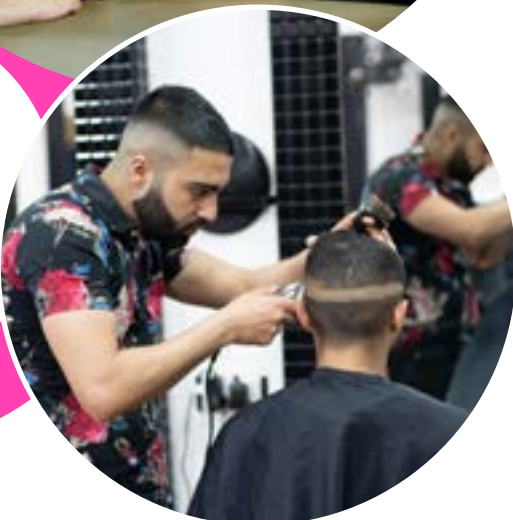
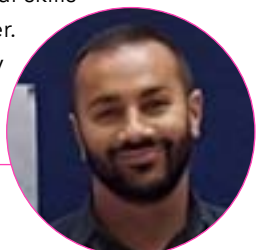

WORK PLACEMENT

As part of our Employability Pledge at college, all our 16 – 18 study programme students will have the opportunity to complete work experience, and undertake a work placement during their time at college. You will work with a dedicated Work Experience Coach, who will help you find a placement suited to your course or chosen career, or complete work experience to achieve a Careers and Personal Development Passport Award.



CAREER PROGRESSION

The great thing about these courses is that as you develop your skills, you can start earning money! At the end of the two to three years, you will be fully qualified in your chosen trade. Many students progress to work in salons, spas, makeup counters or become self-employed. You can also continue your studies with management qualifications or specialist professional qualifications. Students who complete the Level 3 Media Makeup course can also progress to university.
