PARENT PORTAL

You can view your young person's progress via Parent Portal on the college website. When your young person enrolled at the college, you should have been sent further information to the email address you provided.

If you are struggling to access the Parent Portal, please email **mystudentsupport@kirkleescollege.ac.uk** with the email address and mobile phone number you would like to be registered with and the name and student number of your young person. You will then be sent a link to Pro-Portal.

The mobile number you give us will also be used as our emergency next of kin contact.

MATHS AND ENGLISH

If your young person has not achieved a grade 4 in their English and/or maths GCSE, they will continue to study these subjects at college, as it is a legal requirement that all 16 – 18-year-olds continue to work towards gaining these qualifications.



To enhance their likelihood of achieving at their potential we plan to provide students with three opportunities to sit practice papers over the academic year and focus teaching and learning on areas to develop identified from the practice papers.

Maths practice papers:

Practice 1:

Component 1 non-calculator - 23 September 2024 Component 2 calculator - 7 October 2024

Practice 2:

Component 1 non-calculator - 13 January 2025 Component 2 calculator - 27 January 2025

Practice 3:

Component 1 non-calculator - 3 March 2025 Component 2 calculator - 17 March 2025

English practice papers:

Practice 1: Writing assessment - 4 November 2024
Practice 2: Reading assessment - 9 December 2024
Practice 3: Writing assessment - 3 February 2025
Practice 4: Reading assessment - 17 March 2025

The real GCSE Exams take place in May and June 2025:

- GCSE Maths: Thursday 15 May and Wednesday 4 June
- GCSE English Language: Friday 23 May and Friday 6
 June

These are national exams and cannot be taken on any other date, so please ensure your young person is not on holiday or unavailable on these days.

CAR PARK AT HUDDERSFIELD CENTRE

This is an important reminder that the Chapel Hill Car Park at our main Huddersfield Centre is not open to the public. Cameras are in operation daily and anyone who is not registered on the system will be fined for parking or waiting in the car park.

If you are an adult learner at Kirklees College, you can use the car park on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 5pm for evening classes.

We recommend that if you are dropping off or picking up your young person, you use the pick up and drop off bay at our Manchester Road entrance, or close to the college where it is safe to do so.
