Kirklees College is closing for Christmas on Friday 20 December and will reopen on Monday 6 January at 8.30am.

It's been a great first term at our seven college centres, with students getting involved in our KC Community in a variety of ways. We have also enrolled over 10,600 students and we are proud to say that we have supported 4,127 so far with the college bursary.

PARENT'S EVENINGS

During week commencing 20 January, we will be hosting our next set of Parent's evenings. You will be sent a letter confirming the details for your young person's Parent's Evening closer to the time, but please look out for this as these evenings are a fantastic opportunity to catch up on your young person's progress at college with their tutors.

COST OF LIVING PAYMENT TO FAMILIES IN RECEIPT OF FREE SCHOOL MEALS FUNDING

In conjunction with Kirklees Council, we have issued a Costof-Living payment to families in Kirklees who are in receipt of Free School Meals funding. These students' families have been identified through the bursary process. A payment of £45 has been made to the bank details on the students' bursary application.

Where bank details were not included in the application, supermarket vouchers were issued. If the student was eligible for Free School Meals at high school, you may still be eligible for FSM and other support from the bursary. For further information email FinSupp@KirkleesCollege.ac.uk.

SAFEGUARDING SUPPORT OVER CHRISTMAS

Safeguarding is our highest priority at Kirklees College and we take every possible action to make sure all students, staff and the wider college community are kept safe and protected.

MATHS AND ENGLISH GCSE UPDATE

If your young person has not achieved a grade 4 in their English and/or maths GCSE, they will continue to study these subjects at college, as it is a legal requirement that all 16-18-year-olds continue to work towards gaining these qualifications.

To enhance their likelihood of achieving at their potential we have planned practice papers over the academic year and will focus teaching on areas to develop identified from the practice papers.

Maths practice papers:

Component 1 non-calculator - 13 January 2025 Component 2 calculator - 27 January 2025

Component 1 non-calculator - 3 March 2025 Component 2 calculator - 17 March 2025

English practice papers:

Practice 3: Writing assessment - 3 February 2025 Practice 4: Reading assessment - 17 March 2025

The real GCSE Exams take place in May and June 2025:

- GCSE Maths: Thursday 15 May and Wednesday 4 June
- GCSE English Language: Friday 23 May and Friday 6 June

These are national exams and cannot be taken on any other date, so please ensure your young person is not on holiday or unavailable on these days.

WELCOMING OUR FIRST COHORT OF CONSTRUCTION STUDENTS IN DEWSBURY

Earlier this year, we announced an exciting new partnership with Kirklees Council called Kirklees Build. The partnership is all about reintroducing Construction courses to Dewsbury and as part of this, we opened our new Construction workshop at Springfield Sixth Form Centre. In September, we welcomed our first cohort of Construction Multi-Skills students, and from September 2025 we will be running Level 1 Electrical and Plumbing courses at the centre.

In the long-term, the Construction hub will move to a live building site in North Kirklees, where Kirklees College students will be involved in the construction of a new housing estate.

ENRICHMENT AND PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT HIGHLIGHTS

KIRKLEES COLLEGE ART STUDENTS WORK ON DISPLAY IN DEWSBURY

Over the last two years, Level 2 and 3 Creative Industries students at Kirklees College have been collaborating on various projects with the Dewsbury Arcade Group. The student's work is centred around the Dewsbury Arcade, which is a focal point of Kirklees Council's Dewsbury Blueprint regeneration project, and is currently undergoing major reconstruction. The historic arcade, which was once the epicentre of Dewsbury's retail sector, will be reopened in Summer 2025 as the UK's first community-run shopping centre.

To promote the Arcade's reopening, the student's work about the Arcade is currently on display in an exhibition at the Princess of Wales Shopping Centre in Dewsbury town centre. The artwork on display is from the last two academic years, and showcases the student's individual styles and interpretations of briefs given to them by the Arcade Group. The artwork is also displayed on wrap-around hoardings at the Dewsbury Arcade – go take a look if you are local!
