Celebrating Student Success this Summer

This year was one of our most successful yet when it comes to our Level 3 and T Level results, as we celebrated an outstanding 95% pass rate. This includes a 94% pass rate on BTEC Level 3 qualifications, 91% pass rate for all Level 3 students and an incredible 98% pass rate on Access courses.

We're also proud to share that 40 Level 3 courses achieved a pass rate of over 95%, with 16 of these reaching 100%. This is a true testament to the hard work, talent, and determination of our students, and the dedication of our amazing staff.

Student Finance Reminder

CHANGING

Kirklees College offers a range of support funds to help students overcome any financial problems that may prevent them from studying.

Costs such as travel or meals may stop some students from joining or continuing a course or programme.

Please encourage your young person to visit Student Services at their centre of study to get advice on financial matters and help with applying for any available grants or funding.

16 - 19 Bursary Fund

The 16 - 19 Bursary Fund provides Student Finance to help students overcome specific financial barriers to help them remain in education.

Support is available to students in the following three categories:

- Students aged under 19 in receipt of Universal Credit, who are in care or are a care leaver, or in receipt of certain disability benefits
- Students with a household income of under £35,000
- Students with a household income of over £35,000, who demonstrate that money will be a barrier to completing their studies

We also offer support with travel costs if you live over a mile from your young person's centre of study and qualify for financial assistance. We can provide eligible students with a monthly bus ticket on the MCard app, or a contribution towards the cost of alternative means of travel. If your young person lives within one mile of college but has a medical condition or care commitments, they may still be eligible for travel cost support which our team will discuss with them.
