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Engineering students help produce 3D printed model of Huddersfield Canal

Four Kirklees College students have stepped into the world of civil engineering with a hands-on project led by Jackson Civil Engineering.

Using 3D printing, they recreated a section of the Huddersfield Broad Canal towpath, complete with a working lock mechanism.

The project - called CanalWorks 3D – kicked off in the classroom back in October when a Jackson team visited the students and talked to them about career opportunities in civil engineering, and the scope of the canal towpath improvement works.

The students then visited the work site on the banks of the canal, measuring, sketching, and photographing details as they saw engineers in action and experienced firsthand how an infrastructure project like this comes together.

The project concluded with the students presenting their thoughts on students to members of the Jackson team alongside the Canal Trust and Kirklees College Engineering staff.

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Important Information about mobile phones in Maths and English lessons

There will be an important change to our mobile phone expectations in Maths and English lessons from the start of next term.

Following a serious safeguarding incident last half-term involving the misuse of a mobile phone in class, we have reviewed our procedure to ensure that all learners are safe and able to learn without distraction.

Additionally, recent student voice feedback shows that learners want us to take a firmer approach with regard to mobile phones.

From January, the following rule will apply in all Maths and English lessons:

Mobile phones must be unseen and unheard at all times during the lesson.

If a phone is seen or heard, the learner will be asked to place it in a labelled phone pouch at the front of the classroom for the duration of the lesson.

The learner will keep a matching token and will swap this back at the end of the lesson to collect their phone.

Phones remain the learner's own property, but while they are in our classrooms, they must follow this procedure so that staff can maintain a safe, focused learning environment.

If a learner refuses to follow this instruction, the following will happen:

- They will be removed from the lesson to speak with the Head of Maths or the Head of English.
- The incident will be recorded on their ProMonitor behaviour log.
- Home will be contacted, and further consequences may be put in place in line with our Positive Behaviour Policy.

We recognise that, in a small number of cases, learners may need access to their phone during our lessons. These situations will be considered carefully and individually, and agreed upon in advance with the class teacher or the curriculum lead.

If you have any questions or would like to discuss this further, please contact your young person's Maths or English teacher.
